Patient of the Month Charlie



Charlie came to see us when his mum noticed a large lump on his chest and since he is an indoor/ outdoor cat, his mum was concerned that he was involved in a cat fight and had developed a nasty abscess. Cat fights are the most common cause of abscesses in cats and if left untreated for too lona can potentially send lifethreatening bacteria into the blood stream and throughout the body. Charlie was admitted to hospital where his abscess was treated by our fabulous team. Feline AIDS virus is transmitted in the saliva when cats fight, so all cats who spend outside are at risk of contracting Feline AIDS if they are bitten by another cat. It is very important that cats are vaccinated against the Feline AIDS virus to protect them against this highly infectious disease. Whilst we admire Charlie's bravery, we hope he does not get into anymore cat fights and wish him all the best on his road to recovery!
